


## **Sorting Unifix Cubes\* to 10**

### **Group Activity**

Have students work in pairs to sort and join Unifix into sticks then put the sticks into order, from smallest to largest.

## 1. Spread Unifix cubes on the floor or students' desks

Sprinkle the cubes in clusters around the room.



Check students are pointing to correct sticks as you count.

#### 6. Jumble the sticks and have students resort them in order

This can be used for assessment and for small group work with a parent or aide.


