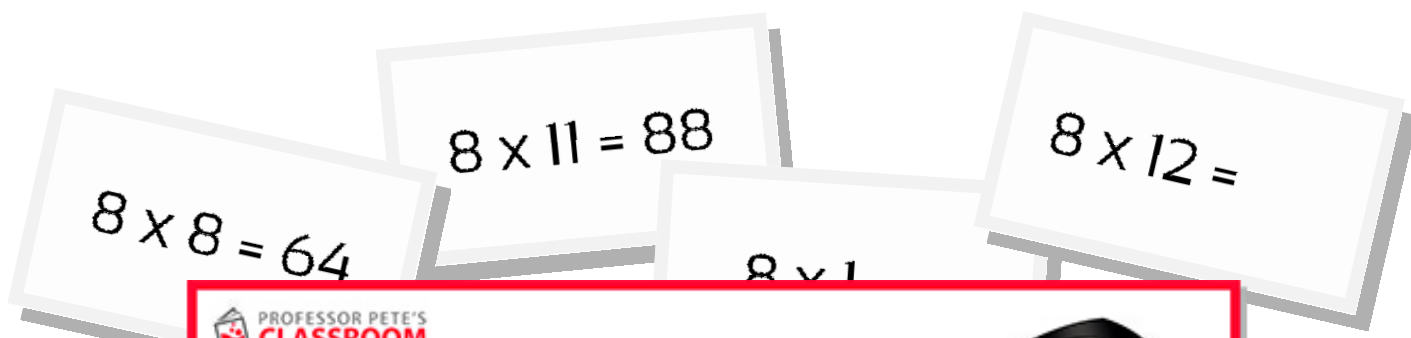

Flashcards without answers:

- Have all students say each number fact as it is shown **with** the answer.
- Have individual students respond with the answer. Make it a speed test .
- Have two or three students race to be the first to respond with the correct answer.
- Have a student say the "turn around" fact
 - ◊ e.g. [8 x 5 = ___] turn around fact: "5 x 8 = 40"
- Have a student give a related division fact
 - ◊ e.g. [8 x 5 = ___] related division fact: "40 ÷ 8 = 5" or "40 ÷ 5 = 8"
- Tell stories about the multiplication fact e.g. "Eight children ate 3 cupcakes each. How many cupcakes altogether?" "A farmer planted eight rows of 6 bushes. How many bushes altogether?" Encourage students to use sensible examples. Large numbers will need different stories. For example a child could not eat 12 hot dogs!
