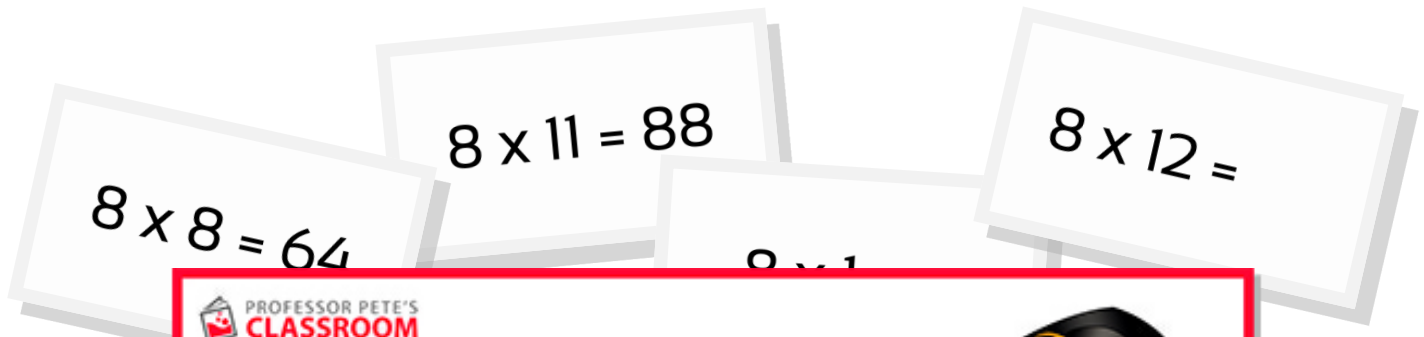


Multiplication Flash Cards

8 x (Letter size)



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Multiplication

Print and cut out each card for a set of flashcards.

Flashcards with answers:

- Have all students say each number fact as it is shown **with** the answer.
- Have individual students respond with the answer. Make it a speed test.
- Have two or three students race to be the first to respond with the correct answer.
- Have a student say the "turn around" fact
 - ◇ e.g. [$8 \times 5 = 40$] turn around fact: " $5 \times 8 = 40$ "
- Have a student give a related division fact
 - ◇ e.g. [$8 \times 5 = 40$] related division fact: " $40 \div 8 = 5$ " or " $40 \div 5 = 8$ "

Flashcards without answers:

- Have all students say each number fact as it is shown **with** the answer.
- Have individual students respond with the answer. Make it a speed test.
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- Have a student say the "turn around" fact
 - ◇ e.g. [$8 \times 5 = \underline{\quad}$] turn around fact: " $5 \times 8 = 40$ "
- Have a student give a related division fact
 - ◇ e.g. [$8 \times 5 = \underline{\quad}$] related division fact: " $40 \div 8 = 5$ " or " $40 \div 5 = 8$ "
- Tell stories about the multiplication fact e.g. "Eight children ate 3 cupcakes each. How many cupcakes altogether?" "A farmer planted eight rows of 6 bushes. How many bushes altogether?" Encourage students to use sensible examples. Large numbers will need different stories. For example a child could not eat 12 hot dogs!

$$8 \times 0 = 0$$

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$$8 \times 1 = 8$$

$$8 \times 2 = 16$$

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$$8 \times 3 = 24$$
