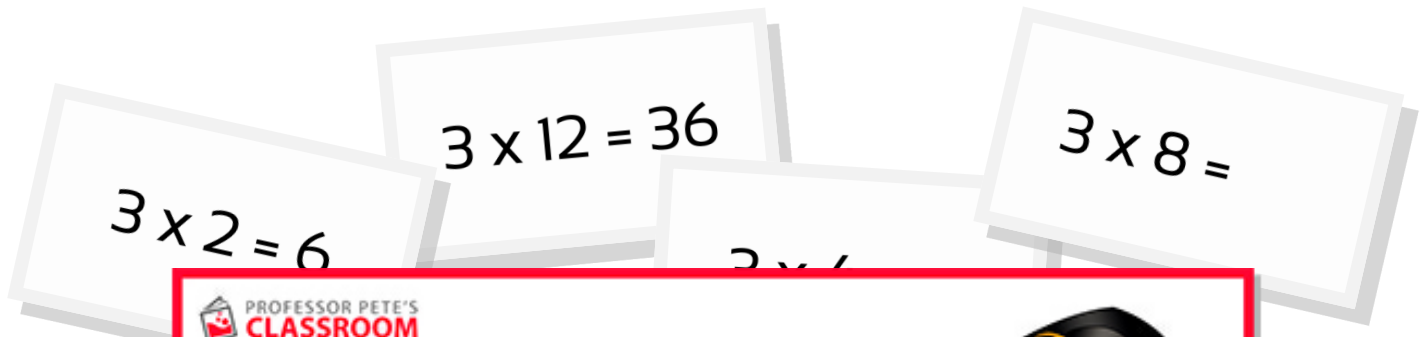


# Multiplication Flash Cards

## Multiplication

Print and cut out each card for a set of flashcards.

### Flashcards with answers:

- Have students say each number fact as it is shown **with** the answer.
- Have individual students respond with the answer. Make it a speed test.
- Have two or three students race to be the first to respond with the correct answer.
- Have a student say the "turn around" fact
  - ◇ e.g. [ $3 \times 5 = 15$ ] turn around fact: " $5 \times 3 = 15$ "
- Have a student give a related division fact
  - ◇ e.g. [ $3 \times 5 = 15$ ] related division fact: " $15 \div 3 = 5$ " or " $15 \div 5 = 3$ "

### Flashcards without answers:

- Have all students say each number fact as it is shown **with** the answer.
- Have individual students respond with the answer. Make it a speed test.
- Have two or three students race to be the first to respond with the correct answer.
- Have a student say the "turn around" fact
  - ◇ e.g. [ $3 \times 5 = \underline{\quad}$ ] turn around fact: " $5 \times 3 = 15$ "
- Have a student give a related division fact
  - ◇ e.g. [ $3 \times 5 = \underline{\quad}$ ] related division fact: " $15 \div 3 = 5$ " or " $15 \div 5 = 3$ "
- Tell stories about the multiplication fact e.g. "Three children ate 2 cupcakes each. How many cupcakes altogether?" "A farmer planted eight rows of 6 bushes. How many bushes altogether?" Encourage students to use sensible examples. Large numbers will need different stories. For example a child could not eat 12 hot dogs!
